1715-1771 1716-1779 in Dunham cemetery

96 → found Nathan Burns md. Elizabeth Dunham
1748-1812 Pvt. Middlesex Co. Militia
Sgt. N.J. State Troops
Fought at Long Island '76 White Plains '76
Monmouth '76 Springfield '80
served til close of Rev. War

Piscataway Township (Maitland Lane Rutger First Home)

William Churchward served during Rev War
1750-1793 1st Reg. Middlesex Co. Militia
also in Continental Army

Stone therefore gone no longer to be found
It was the only stone in that area
Found & lost soon after Rutger Homeing
3rd Professors just after World War II
